Even our youngest audience will not be left out – there is going to be a concert and a music lesson entitled Father and Son performed by **Robert Kamplet** and his son **Nejc**.

Furthermore fans of the modern ballet are also eagerly awaiting this year's festival. With the title False Entries, **Jasmina Križaj**'s choreography will inspire the spectators.
